

Third Albanian Rural Parliament 2023

THE 3rd ALBANIAN RURAL PARLIAMENT - a national platform dedicated to capacity building, networking, and advocacy for sustainable rural development – takes place at the premises of Agriculture University of Tirana, from October 11 to 13, 2023. The 3rd Albanian Rural Parliament represents a collaborative effort between the Albanian Network for Rural Development (ANRD) and its thirty-four member CSOs, in partnership with the Agriculture University of Tirana (AUT).

This platform represents the most sustainable bottom-up advocacy effort, creating space for dialogue and cooperation, exchange of perspectives on important and current issues of rural and agricultural development, and providing recommendations toward revitalizing rural life and economy. The platform of this third edition will offer innovative ways and new approaches to reach a broad consensus on rural development priorities at the national level and to strengthen the civil and private sector's voice to benefit sustainable rural development.

The third Parliament comes with an upgraded platform, creating for the first time ever opportunities for young people from rural areas, young farmers and entrepreneurs to gather in their Youth Assembly: with the youth, for the youth, by the youth of the ANRD Rural Youth Hub themselves. Also, the 5th Edition of Pro Rural Women 2023 will be organized within the platform of the Rural Parliament to strengthen advocacy for an agricultural and rural sector, for communities, and a society with equal opportunities for all.

The theme of the 3rd Albanian Rural Parliament - LIFE SPRINGS FROM THE VILLAGE - sets the stage for meaningful dialogue and collaboration, to analyze the reality and get better acquainted with the needs and problems, to reflect on the vision and priorities as collective actions to further empower and uplift rural communities across the country. "Life springs from the village' serves as a powerful call to action for fostering sustainable rural development, as it reflects the profound truth that the development and progress of Albania originate from its rural areas. "Life springs from the village" highlights the importance of supporting rural economies, investing in infrastructure, and education and creating opportunities for the youth within their communities. It urges us to reevaluate the importance of rural communities and their economy in the context of the current challenges, including climate change, outmigration from rural areas and etc.

Reflections on a Journey to Albania's Third Rural Parliament

Some eight years have passed since the establishment of the Albanian Network for Rural Development (ANRD), which seeks to promote the LEADER approach in Albania, focusing on supporting and building the capacities of public and private actors in rural areas, building partnerships in creating Local Action Groups (LAGs), as well as increasing the confidence of rural society to follow the path of European sustainable development policies and practices.

At one go, ANRD has also developed national advocacy for supportive and encouraging policies on the development of the LEADER approach as well as supportive financial policies and schemes for farmers and other engaged actors, to channel their confidence and motivation in this path. Supporting social capital has been and remains a priority for ANRD.

The 3rd Albanian Rural Parliament is an even more dedicated effort in empowering important social groups, and specifically builds on two important pillars for rural life and the LEADER approach, that of the Rural Youth Hub and the support of Pro-Rural Women initiative.

The rural parliament comes at a time when, due to bottom-up advocacy, the Parliament of Albania adopted the Law on Local Action Groups, thus creating a real opportunity for developing partnerships to strengthen local and rural cooperation.

Yet, the preparation of local actors, local self-government units, business, and civil society is still far from a sustainable investment to increase the confidence of actors in coming together for instigating changes. The Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development should place more efforts to open the processes to societal actors and boost collaboration among them. The support of farmers or rural tourist enterprises should be accompanied by raising awareness of local communities in evaluating them, say "guesthouses", as a quality instrument for strengthening the Local Action Groups of the area. This is also and contributes to sustainable development, because it is an investment in human capital.

ANRD comes to this national event more consolidated, with an increasing membership trend and an activity that crosses the borders of the country.

The network is present across the country and has established cooperation relations with all local self-government units. The goal for the future remains its consolidation as a resource center for the rural development of the country and the implementation of the LEADER approach.

I am pleased to point out that ANRD has increased its presence in many European organizations and activities. At the same time, it has been awarded several prizes, including the Green Flag from CIA Agricoltori Italiani, attesting to the great work it has done over the years in the sector of civil society empowerment and rural development in Albania. Administratively, the Network is now fully independent and leads and manages regional projects funded by the EU and other donors.

The Albanian Network for Rural Development is expanding and cooperating with public institutions in the country. In addition to the excellent cooperation with the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, communication with the Parliamentary Committee for Production Activity has also increased, which we consider to be a crucial indicator on the impact of the ANRD's work.

The Agricultural University of Tirana remains our main partner not just for the physical space of its premises, that it has kindly shared over the years, but also for the continuous support to and advice in our work.

In conclusion, allow me to wholeheartedly thank all donors that have supported the Albanian Network for Rural Development over these years, our collaborators across the country, and all the participants in this important activity.

DECLARATION

The General Assembly of the Albanian Network for Rural Development convened on April 7, 2023.

We, the thirty-four member organizations of the General Assembly of the Albanian Network for Rural Development, convened on April 7, 2023 are pleased to announce the start of preparations for the third National Rural Parliament to be held on October 11-13, 2023.

The National Rural Parliament seeks to bring together a vast array of stakeholders, including local communities, local organizations, the private sector and policymakers, and Albania's 61 municipalities, to deliberate on the challenges and opportunities confronting rural development in our communities. The third Albanian Rural Parliament fully complies with the vision of the Crosscutting Strategy on Agricultural and Rural Development and Fisheries 2021-2027 and, particularly, with Policy 1 - Sustainable Development of Agriculture and Rural Areas - and the third overall goal of this policy.

The National Rural Parliament's platform draws attention to some other essential specifics of this goal: *Strengthening the (ecological), social and economic structure of rural areas; Promoting local development (by improving the livelihoods in remote and mountainous areas and adequately integrating local communities, supporting the development of extensive pastoralism), through employment and business development opportunities on and off the agricultural (and livestock) farm, as well as through community-led initiatives.*

The platform of this third edition will offer innovative ways and new approaches to reach a broad consensus on rural development priorities at the national level, which are related at higher levels, and to strengthen the civil and private sector's voice to benefit sustainable rural development.

We are convinced that rural development is critical for achieving sustainable and inclusive growth and improving the rural population's livelihoods. However, rural development faces many challenges, including poverty, limited access to essential services, lack of infrastructure, and the impact of climate change. Moreover, mass tourism that fails to respect the local population's cultural life and lifestyle is not providing the right energy for sustainable rural development.

We believe that this platform will be an opportunity to exchange experiences, share knowledge and ideas on how we can overcome these challenges, and promote sustainable rural development. By bringing stakeholders together, we hope to foster partnerships and collaborations that will enable

us to develop and implement innovative and local solutions to promote sustainable rural development.

We commit to working together to create an inclusive and participatory Parliament, where the voices and perspectives of all stakeholders, particularly vulnerable groups, are heeded and taken into account.

We strive to sustain this platform for dialogue, exchange of best practices, and learning from each other's experiences to develop concrete proposals for sustainable rural development initiatives.

We call upon all stakeholders to join us in this sustainable rural advocacy effort and actively participate in this dialogue, networking, and advocacy platform.

Improving the quality of life of rural communities is the only option to make the Albanian countryside attractive to live, work, and build the future.

INSIGHTS INTO THE EVENT AND PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The 3nd Albanian Rural Parliament represents a collaborative effort between ANRD and its thirty-four CSOs, in partnership with the Agriculture University of Tirana. This initiative, driven by ANRD and its thirty-four member organizations, presents a unique platform within rural Albania. As grassroots civil society organizations, these member organizations establish a direct link between the local, regional, and national levels. Their extensive geographical reach spans the entire country, offering unparalleled access to local communities.

The partnership between AUT and ANRD in convening the third Albanian Rural Parliament helps bridge the gap between research and practice. The combination of AUT academic staff and ANRD member organizations in organizing the thematic workshops (rural talks) around eight main themes will blend the theoretical and research background with practical examples and grass-root experiences.

This three-day event is turning into a significant national gathering, bringing together public and non-public representatives from the 61 municipalities, regions, donors, academia, and central government bodies. The rural parliament creates space for interaction of relevant rural stakeholders to articulate their positions and roles in rural development, as well as the challenges they face to exert their agency and influence. As the overall platform of the ARP will focus on the real problems that persist in rural areas across Albania, it will search of feasible and practical solutions to farmers and rural residents' challenges, and in the end will provide a set of policy recommendations that address the development priorities of these areas.

The rural parliament platform supports the small and family farms by reflecting a strong concern about the future well-being of small farming communities. The gatherings like rural parliament aim at finding practical solutions which address these concerns, including the role of cooperatives, the diversification of farm and rural economies, management of pastures, investment in infrastructure, support for young farmers, gender equality etc. While the contribution of big farmers in the nation economy is recognized, the concern for the well-being of small farmers is righteous. As the challenges and constraints that adversely affect rural development in Albania and in particular small farming communities will be identified in the rural talk's sessions, the Joint Declaration of the 3rd ARP will reflect such concerns and advocate for the well-being of smallholders.

The platform of the 3rd Albanian Rural Parliament focuses on the reality of young people in rural areas amidst challenges and aspirations for the future. Given their important role and contribution to the sustainability of community life in rural areas, agriculture and food security, their migration is one of the biggest challenges and the main sustainability risk for the whole sector. Existing public policies have been ineffective in addressing

issues related to youth inclusion in agriculture, as well as the increasing trend of their migration.

In 2019, ANRD launched Rural Youth Hub, involving rural young people, enthusiasts, students, entrepreneurs, farmers who are enthusiast and motivated to play an active role and contribute to rural development processes and decision-making. This long-term group amplifies the voice of young people in rural Albania and influence rural decision-making, to make such processes youth oriented and closely linked with the currents needs and interests of rural youth. It promotes action by rural youth. The 3rd ARP programme introduces a novel aspect: for the first time ever young people from rural areas, young farmers and entrepreneurs gather in their Youth Assembly: with the youth, for the youth, by the youth of the ANRD Rural Youth Hub.

Empowerment of women and girls in rural areas has been at the core of ANRD bottom-up advocacy to advance women's interests and priorities and generate public supports for enhanced socio-economic opportunities. Women in rural areas are important actors in the agri-food sector and the main contributors to the agricultural and rural sector. However, the sector is not helping rural women to improve their social economic status due to the difficulties and challenges they experience that undermine productivity and entrepreneurial potential and generate unequal benefits for men and women in value chains in the agri-food sector.

For the fifth year in a row (2023), on the occasion of the International Day of Rural Women, the 2023 'Pro Rural Women' Edition will bring together rural women and girls to discuss concerns, priorities as well as concrete actions that should be encouraged and undertaken by institutions for the well-being of women and girls in rural areas. ANRD, its member organizations and our partners care about the wellbeing of women and girls in rural areas, so we will strive to sustain our advocacy work to acknowledge the invaluable role and contribution of women in agriculture and rural development and build society-wide solidarity to empower women and girls in rural areas.

ANRD further holds an important role as the national partner for the European Rural Parliament and Balkan Rural Parliament, two pan-European campaigns amplifying the voices of rural Europe. ANRD's involvement with these regional and European initiatives brings forth remarkable synergy. ANRD representatives actively participate in both ERP and BRP events, taking on roles as key speakers and presenters and active participants. This unique platform allows ANRD to not only engage a broader audience but also champion the concept of rural parliaments, reinforcing their role as important instruments for rural development.

The 3nd Albanian Rural Parliament envisages plenary sessions, rural talks, discussions, keynote speakers, etc. It serves as a crucial platform for policy makers, public and private institutions, civil society organizations, the donor community, academia and others to assess ongoing progress and

promote changes in policies and practices to ensure the development of the "Albanian Rural Agenda" through an inclusive approach that encompasses all rural residents, fostering their participation in shaping this transformative process.

First National Assembly of Young People in Rural Areas: The Present and future of youth in rural areas

ANRD and its member organizations and partners, remains committed to advocating for the wellbeing of women and girls in rural areas. This sustained advocacy effort acknowledges the indispensable roles and contributions of women in agriculture and rural development while fostering widespread societal solidarity to empower women and girls in rural areas.

This special gathering, an annual tradition by ANRD, takes place on the second day of the ARP, celebrating the International Day of Rural Women. The energy of the Young Assembly and the empowerment of rural women turn ARP into an inclusive event that embraces all.

LAUNCHING TWO SUSTAINABLE RURAL DEVELOPMENT AWARDS – an initiative dedicating to honoring the exceptional legacy of two professionals who championed to sustainable rural development in Albania. ANRD aims to establish a legacy that fosters continued development and progress in Albanian rural communities by recognizing leaders and creating a network of changer makers and further amplifying their efforts on national and local level.

A CELEBRATION OF ALBANIAN RURAL LIFE, CULTURE, AND DIALOGUE that fosters a deeper connection with Albania's rural heart.

The ARP program provides an inclusive platform to collectively celebrate rural life and culture, offering a range of engaging activities including fair, open-air cinema, photo exhibition, and demonstration. This program extends an open invitation to all participants, inviting them to take part in celebrating the richness and diversity of Albanian rural area.

Local foods, masterly prepared by the women participants of the 5th Pro-Rural Women edition, will showcase territorial products of rural Albania.

The open-air cinema invites those enthusiasts to share their insights, fostering an open dialogue amongst participants as they engage into discussions following the screening of documentaries. Meanwhile, the Rural Albania photography exhibition takes participants on a visual journey through capturing the very essence of rural life in Albania. Adding to the experience, another corner of this program invites participants to engage in tasting sessions, where they can observe the artisanal preparation of local products. Women participants will proudly wear xhubleta and various local costumes, showcasing the vibrant local heritage of rural areas.

These elements come together to offer an enriching celebration of rural life and culture and an opportunity to foster connections and understanding amongst participants.

Albanian Network for Rural Development (ANRD) is a network of thirty-four local CSOs with consolidated profiles in rural development, established from the 'bottom-up' in 2105 (anrd.al) aiming at contributing to the sustainable development of rural communities in Albania. ANRD is a policy network in the domain of rural development emerged as a need to ensure effective policymaking on rural development through direct involvement of non-public stakeholders in the formulation and implementation of rural development policies.

ANRD strives to advocate for effective rural policies, which are closer to residents of rural communities; designed with the participation of local communities, understood and implemented with the people in the ground.
